## **Class Materials List**

Cost effective alternatives underlined.

- 1. Stay-Wet Palette Plastic palettes to hold the paint and are air tight to help keep paints clean longer. It is possible to <u>DIY using tupperware, paper towels and wax paper.</u>
- 2. Enamel butcher tray or Disposable Paper Palette for mixing. <u>Alternative: any</u> white plate or plastic shallow dish. There are always things that will work just perfectly at the thrift store. **Note: Enamel or ceramic are the best for easy** <u>cleanup.</u>
- 3. Brushes Buy decent brushes (most of the cheaper ones lose hairs and you will endlessly be picking them out of your painting).
  - a. Ashley Natural Bristle Brush 10 Bright
  - b. Ashley Natural Bristle Brush 6 Flat
  - c. Simply Simmons Long Handle Brush, Synthetic Round 8
  - d. Simply Simmons Short Handle Brush, Filbert 12
  - e. Titanium Brush, Filberts-Long Handle 10
- 4. Paint Colors
  - a. 1980 Oil Colors, 37ml Titanium Buff
  - b. 1980 Oil Colors, 37ml Quinacridone Red
  - c. Winton Oil Colors, 37ml Lemon Yellow
  - d. Academy Oils, 37ml Viridian
  - e. Academy Oils, 37ml Thalo Blue
  - f. Academy Oils, 37ml Raw Umber
  - g. Academy Oils, 37ml French Ultramarine
  - h. Academy Oils, 37ml Grumbacher Red
  - i. Academy Oils, 37ml Burnt Sienna
  - j. Academy Oils, 37ml Titanium White
  - k. Academy Oils, 37ml Yellow Ochre
- 5. Gamblin Solvent Free Gel Medium
- 6. Gamsol 16 oz
- 7. Gamblin Solvent-Free Safflower Oil Medium

- 8. Glass containers- 1 mid sized (about the size of a Pasta Sauce jar) and 2 small jars (baby food or jam jar size)
- 9. Silicoil Brush Cleaning Tank
- 10. Palette Knife (a trowel-shaped blade is preferred because it makes it easier to work the knife into the painting.)
- 11. Apron. An old oversized shirt will also work just as well. I recommend wearing old clothes and shoes to class.
- 12. Canvas Pad (9x12 inches. This should be real canvas and not canvas paper)
- 13.5 Canvas boards (8x10 inches)
- 14.1 Canvas (16x20 inches, stretched)
- 15. Drawing Board this is for paper & canvas support. <u>Alternative: Pick up a piece</u> of Masonite at Home Depot or Lowes, they will cut it down to a manageable carry size.
- 16. Newsprint
- 17. Sketchbook This is for planning paintings and sketching. A heavier weight paper allows for flexible use. *My preferred sketchbook is the soft cover Moleskine Sketchbook.* <u>Alternative: This can be anything from index cards to card stock printer paper.</u>
- 18. Pencil HB
- 19. Charcoal Pencil 2B, 4B, 6B and White
- 20. Chamois cloth
- 21. Tracing Paper
- 22. Kneaded/White Plastic Eraser
- 23. Pencil Sharpener
- 24. Ruler
- 25. Paper towels
- 26. Rags (old t-shirts)
- 27. Hand Towel (old one you don't care about)
- 28.1" Painters tape
- 29.10 pack Vinyl Gloves
- 30. Paint scraper (optional)
- 31. Dish Soap
- 32. Plier
- 33. Bag or Backpack -whatever you have that works...reusable grocery bags, big blue IKEA bags, or an old carryon suitcase with wheels.
