## Class Materials List

Cost effective alternatives underlined.

1. Stay-Wet Palette - Plastic palettes to hold the paint and are air tight to help keep paints clean longer.It is possible to DIY using tupperware, paper towels and wax paper.
2. Enamel butcher tray or Disposable Paper Palette for mixing. Alternative: any white plate or plastic shallow dish. There are always things that will work just perfectly at the thrift store. Note: Enamel or ceramic are the best for easy cleanup.
3. Brushes - Buy decent brushes (most of the cheaper ones lose hairs and you will endlessly be picking them out of your painting).
a. Ashley Natural Bristle Brush 10 - Bright
b. Ashley Natural Bristle Brush 6 - Flat
c. Simply Simmons Long Handle Brush, Synthetic Round 8
d. Simply Simmons Short Handle Brush, Filbert 12

4. Paint Colors
a. 1980 Oil Colors, 37 ml Titanium Buff
b. 1980 Oil Colors, 37 ml Quinacridone Red
c. Winton Oil Colors, 37ml Lemon Yellow
d. Academy Oils, 37 ml Viridian
e. Academy Oils, 37 ml Thalo Blue
f. Academy Oils, 37ml Raw Umber
g. Academy Oils, 37ml French Ultramarine
h. Academy Oils, 37 ml Grumbacher Red
i. Academy Oils, 37 ml Burnt Sienna
j. Academy Oils, 37ml Titanium White
k. Academy Oils, 37 ml Yellow Ochre
5. Gamblin Solvent Free Gel Medium
6. Gamsol 16 oz
7. Gamblin Solvent-Free Safflower Oil Medium
8. Glass containers- 1 mid sized (about the size of a Pasta Sauce jar) and 2 small jars (baby food or jam jar size)
9. Silicoil Brush Cleaning Tank
10. Palette Knife (a trowel-shaped blade is preferred because it makes it easier to work the knife into the painting.)
11. Apron. An old oversized shirt will also work just as well. I recommend wearing old clothes and shoes to class.
12. Canvas Pad ( $9 \times 12$ inches. This should be real canvas and not canvas paper)
13.5 Canvas boards ( $8 \times 10$ inches)
13. 1 Canvas ( $16 \times 20$ inches, stretched)
14. Drawing Board - this is for paper \& canvas support. Alternative: Pick up a piece of Masonite at Home Depot or Lowes, they will cut it down to a manageable carry size.
15. Newsprint
16. Sketchbook - This is for planning paintings and sketching. A heavier weight paper allows for flexible use. My preferred sketchbook is the soft cover Moleskine Sketchbook. Alternative: This can be anything from index cards to card stock printer paper.
17. Pencil - HB
18. Charcoal Pencil - 2B, 4B, 6B and White
19. Chamois cloth
20. Tracing Paper
21. Kneaded/White Plastic Eraser
22. Pencil Sharpener
23. Ruler
24. Paper towels
25. Rags (old t-shirts)
26. Hand Towel (old one you don't care about)
27. 1" Painters tape
28. 10 pack Vinyl Gloves
29. Paint scraper (optional)
30. Dish Soap
31. Plier
32. Bag or Backpack -whatever you have that works...reusable grocery bags, big blue IKEA bags, or an old carryon suitcase with wheels.
